The Board meets via Zoom three times per year (spring, summer, fall) and one in-person meeting in January at the Community Center in Upper Darby.

Board members are asked to serve on various ad hoc committees throughout the year and there will generally be some light tasks and responsibilities between meetings. Board members are also asked to either raise \$3,000 annually or make a personal financial gift to the Organization each year.

Board members are elected to a 2-year term. Board members may be elected to a maximum of three consecutive terms or six (6) consecutive years, after which time they must step down from the board for at least 1-year.
